Not long ago, I busied myself with a small mathematical exercise. If the good Lord would give me another year, in 2026 I will reach the age of 65. That year is significant—it marks the 250th anniversary of our nation. Here comes the math: Dividing my age in 2026 by 250 yields 0.26. I have often thought it would be neat to own a pickup. I shopped for trucks as I drove down the road. Over the years I have led memorial services for friends with pickups. I couldn't help but notice that, upon departing this world, my friends had to leave their truck on the driveway. I mean no disrespect. But I decided that I didn't "need" a pickup truck, though I own one now.

In my January article I reflected on my animals. Their lives are short, so I treat each one as if her days were numbered, for indeed they are. But since my cancer diagnosis, I have come to the realization that my furry friends could, in fact, outlast me. Oh, no! Who will feed my cats? Who will feed the squirrels? I'm kidding, of course. LB will feed the cats; God will feed the squirrels.

Anyway, are you numbering your days? Are you making plans today that will "count for eternity"? Have you that assurance which comes by knowing (believing) that when the time comes to draw your last breath, you will wake up in heaven? Have you truly repented of your sins and entrusted your soul (and body) to the One who died for you? Shameless evangelism, I know.

It is easy to make excuses for the way we live and the decisions we make that don't serve anyone but ourselves, and don't include God at all. Because time and space are short, I'll be blunt: If you haven't already, turn from your selfish ways. Turn to Christ. Trust him as only Lord and Savior. Find your satisfaction and joy in him, and not in things this world may offer, which are fleeting.

The future is bright for those who "count their days." There is joy in *letting go* of things that don't matter. There is hope in *grabbing on* to God's promises, the things that matter and that are *stored up* for those who wait for Christ's coming, and believe his promises (John 14:1-3). For these, the future does not intimidate. Instead, it invites. In fact, it *beckons*. It is best we embrace the future. That begins by embracing Christ, the Hope of the World. The hope of us.



2025 August Financial Synopsis

Offering giving for August 2024 was \$12.9k compared to budgeted of \$17.6k. The amount is similar to Aug 2024's giving of \$12.9k but represents a shortfall of \$4.7k from budgeted offerings. Total income for August was \$13.1k with expenses of \$20.8k resulting in a net deficit of \$7.7k for August.

YTD income was \$191.6k with expenses at \$199.6k bringing a YTD deficit of \$8k. This is with the assistance of transfer from Endowments of \$50,000.

Bank balance is comfortable at \$34.3 k which will finance 1.5 months of expenses.

The Presbytery has approved the sale of BAN properties, a broker will be appointed and all sale terms will need to be reviewed and approved by Session, the Congregation, Presbytery and the Attorney General of NY.

Women of the Church (WOC-BAN) accounts have been closed and are being transferred to the New Covenant Fund to the Hine/Muir/ BAN PC Endowment Fund. In Dec 2018 Session had approved transfers from Funds Held For balances to reduce the church deficit at that time and \$3,000 was transferred in the books from the WOC BAN balance but no actual cash amount was transferred. This amount will have to be transferred back from the Hine/Muir/ BAN PC Endowment Fund to CPC. This will help the bank balance.

Comparison of prior years' results are as follows (dollars rounded to nearest \$100):

Endowment balances are doing excellently at \$508.2k in spite of the \$50k transfer during the year. We continue to thank God for these fiscal blessings that have been left to the Church. What a legacy this is!

The negative unrestricted funds will continue to grow if we have more deficits in the coming months. We have a remainder of \$11k budgeted to transfer from Endowments for the rest of the year.

Monthly expenses at \$20.8k showed a slight decrease as there were fewer payroll expenses due to a book entry to offset Pastor's return of disability payment made earlier in the year and reduced utilities cost. The YTD deficit does not look too bad at -\$8,000 but this is with the assistance of \$50,000 from Endowments.

With Harvestfest just around the corner may we enjoy a time of thankfulness and fellowship. Please consider faithfully pledging for next year.

Cathy has updated the Payment Card Industry standards (PCI Compliance) and we are certified for a year until August 2026, thereby avoiding a non-compliance fine of \$20 per month.

E-giving for Aug 2025 YTD was \$4,576.63; Aug 2024 YTD was \$8,268.20.
